



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 09
SERIES OF 2021

AN ORDER PRESCRIBING FOR AND REITERATING THE GUIDELINES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF MINIMUM PUBLIC HEALTH SAFETY STANDARDS IN ISABELA CITY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 1987 Constitution and Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991, the City Government of Isabela shall be primarily responsible for the promotion of the general welfare of its constituents;

WHEREAS, on March 8, 2020, the President of the Philippines issued Proclamation No. 922 declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines in order to prompt a whole-of-government approach in addressing the COVID-19 outbreak;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to still implement precautionary measures in the whole city so as to prevent the further spread and transmission of COVID-19 to and among its constituents;


WHEREAS, as of March 26, 2021, there are a total of six (6) active COVID-19 cases in the city of Isabela, Basilan.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SITTI DJALIA T. HATAMAN, City Mayor of Isabela, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order as follows:

I. GUIDELINES FOR THE CITY GOVERNMENT OFFICES

1. Implement strictly the observance of minimum public health safety protocols such as but not limited to wearing of face mask and face shield at the city hall premises at all times.
2. Suspend immediately and indefinitely the Flag raising and Flag lowering ceremonies during Mondays and Fridays respectively.
3. Discourage all city hall employees from congregating at lunch break and instead eat their meals separately.
4. Encourage taking out instead of dining in when ordering food at restaurants.

5. Until anti-COVID-19 vaccines are administered to Isabela City Government employees who are considered vulnerable, including Senior citizen employees, except for office personnel whose services are indispensable, all offices shall adopt a flexible working schedule which limits employees' exposure to mass gathering in office. The employees may also adopt alternative working arrangements such as but not limited to work from home arrangements, especially those who are residents of other jurisdictions.
6. Impose mandatory downloading of STAYS SAFE application to all city hall employees and register their offices with QR code pursuant to DILG memorandum released last January 6, 2021.

II. GUIDELINES FOR THE PUBLIC

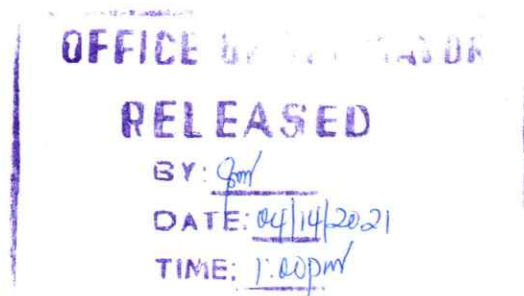
The security cluster of the Isabela City COVID-19 Task Force shall scale up the enforcement of the minimum public health safety standards among the general public such as but not limited to the following:

1. Strict implementation of the use of face mask and face shield in public spaces (buildings, parks, religious institutions, offices, etc.).
2. Ensure that utilization of buildings and other venue or gathering places shall not exceed 50% capacity for both public and private institutions to include religious buildings for any purposes.
3. Impose strict implementation of social distancing in all gatherings whether public or private events.
4. Encourage everyone to avoid dine-in services when ordering food at restaurants and other similar establishments.


This order shall take effect immediately unless earlier revoked, amended, or extended.
